GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING KICKOFF

WELCOME. Patti Hegenbarth welcomed all. She explained that budget was on the tables for review. Lunch is subsidized by membership dues. Look at website if you want to know what's going on. Sandy Eeds had Mo England take a video of the room to send to Connie Gray, who will be out for a year to deal with triple positive breast cancer.

CLGA WEBSITE. Sandy Eeds asked for show of hands for cell phone VS desktop users when accessing website (more desktop hands). She explained that color changes on website indicate new subject matter; more important subjects in red or pink. There is a contact button for CLGA to send suggestions, comments or rule questions. She will pass them onto the applicable parties. Janis Drummond asked if we could use website to pay for things like golf luncheons and tournaments. Patti asked for a show of hands of who uses Venmo VS Zelle (about 80% use one or the other). Wells Fargo needs to tell us if they have this feature available, allowing us to collect funds via website. As we search for another bank, that will be one of the criteria used. When you sign up for CLGA luncheons on the website, you must also sign up on Chelsea and put your check in the box outside north pro shop door. For today's eclectic event, you do NOT need to sign up on Chelsea for the 2nd day. (Although It is always safer to over-sign up on Chelsea in multi day tournaments rather than assume you're already signed up.)

GOLF GENIUS (GG). Nancy Hermanson discussed that this is the 1st day we used GG. At least 1 person in golf party must have it installed on their phone. Pro Shop should explain at check in. There should also be at least one paper scorecard turned into Pro Shop. On GG, you have a choice to select "scorecard" or "edit" ... always "edit" until you make sure

your GG score matches the handwritten score sheet. All experienced GG users should make themselves known and mentor new users as we get used to this exciting new feature for our league. A cheatsheet will be prepared and given to all GG users.

RINGERS. Joanne Malackanich handed out prize money for last year's ringers. Winners are posted on the website.

CAGD. Kathy Sulser said there are 1100 members throughout the state, 39 for CLGA (41 last year). CAGD is explained on our website. It has fun tournaments throughout the year that all CAGD members can participate in at reduced greens fees. The roster is posted in the lady's bathroom. Their year runs January to January so you can still join. On days we conduct CAGD blind draws, it must be a postable score and you MUST putt out. It costs \$1 to enter the weekly CAGD blind draw. Winners will be posted on website.

STATE MEDALLION. Mary Ann Loftquist explained that she picks 4 days a year to enter CLGA members' scores into the state medallion contest. Last year's winners representing us were Kathryn Campbell (gross) and Rita Healy (net). This year's winners are Karen Fischer (gross) and Rita Healy (net), who will be playing in State Medallion at Oakwood in January 2024.

NEW PRESIDENT. Zara Logan thanked everyone for their participation in

the survey. The board listened and is working on changes. For example, we need to have less lunches and easier games to score. Mo England and Kathy Sulser have been providing the board with exciting new ideas such as having special color days. We will start by designating next November playday as PINK DAY. This, of course, is optional.

PUBLICIST. Zara Logan announced that all of the positions for the year have been filled (listed on website directory, password protected) with the exception of publicist. We desperately need someone to volunteer for this position. Judy Onken has been doing it for several years but is retiring. It is a fun way to use your journalism chops by submitting stories monthly to the Sun Lakes Splash.

CHRISTMAS PARTY. Ruby Meyer announced that the Christmas lunch will be on December 14 in the San Tan Ballroom. The menu is poached pear salad with chicken (\$14, subsidized).
