

Captain duties for Scorecards

On the scorecard that is provided, the name on the top of the list of the four golfers is the **designated captain** for the game. The duties of the captain are:

1) Ensure everyone has fun!

2) Ensure that the hole by hole scores are recorded accurately on the original scorecard and that one player is entering the scores into Golf Genius.

-After the last putt on the green is completed and as the players are walking to the golf carts, obtain the scores for that hole. Proceed to the next teeing area promptly to ensure pace of play is maintained

-If a score comes into question have the group recall the stroke by stroke with the player.

Player A states that they had the following shots: Tee shot to the 200 yard marker, Second shot goes to the 100 yard marker, third shot goes into the bunker, fourth shot onto the green ten feet from the hole and then one putt for a 5.

Player B, C, and D say that they saw the player miss the putt by six inches and two putted for a 6.

-At this point the Player A forgot about the missed putt and agrees to the score of 6.

-However, if the Player A is adamant that they made the putt and scored a 5 then on the scorecard record a 5 with a note that the score for that hole is NOT certified. Refer to point number 5.

3) At the end of the game compare the scores hole by hole for all four golfers with the person who is keeping the copy of the scorecard.

4) Ensure that all four players record their signature on the original scorecard and that each golfer agrees with their hole by hole score recorded in Golf Genius and on the paper scorecard.

5) Turn the original scorecard into the Pro Shop immediately after the game and advise the ProShop if there are any hole scores that have not been certified. The rules committee will be notified and will provide a ruling on the score for the Player. The Rules committee will base their decision on the following:

The Player is responsible for their hole by hole score and is expected to act with integrity, and be honest in all aspects of play.

A) If only **one** player observed the strokes on a hole of another player and there is a dispute between the two players of the score then the **player's score will be accepted unless proven otherwise.**

B) If **two or three** players observed the strokes on a hole of another player and there is a dispute between the players of the score then the **player's score will be NOT accepted.** The score that was witnessed by the other players will be certified by the committee, otherwise, the player may be disqualified for signing an incorrect scorecard.
