

Process to determine winners in event of ties:

Major tournaments:

- 1) Overall winner of the major tournaments will be decided by a hole by hole play-off.
The starting hole to be determined by the Pro Shop based on the activity on the course for that day.
- 2) Flight winners will be determined by matching scorecards (also known as a scorecard Count-back). See below “Matching Scorecards” for details.

Regular league play

- 1) Flight/Game winners will be determined by matching scorecards (also known as a scorecard Count-back). See below “Matching Scorecards” for details.

Matching Scorecards

Description:

The winner is determined based on the best score for the last round. If the tying players have the same score for the last round or if the competition consisted of a single round, determine the winner by the following process:

- The lowest back 9 hole total. (Holes 10 to 18).
- If there is still a tie, the lowest last six hole total. (Holes 13 to 18).
- If there is still a tie, the lowest last three hole. (Holes 16 to 18).
- If there is still a tie, the lowest last hole. (Hole 18).
- If there is still a tie, the above process will be repeated using the front nine scores.

If the process does not result in a winner, the result will end in a tie.
