

# ILGA LOCAL RULES

## AERATION HOLES

If a player's ball lies in or touches an aeration hole:

(a) Ball in *General Area*: The player may take relief by **placing** the ball as near as possible to the aeration hole, **not** nearer the hole.

(b) Ball on *Putting Green*: The player may take relief by placing the ball on the spot of the nearest point of relief.

But interference **does not exist** if the aeration hole only interferes with the player's *stance* or, on the putting green, on the player's *line of play*.

THE RULE SHOULD BE WITHDRAWN WHEN THE AERATION HOLES HAVE HEALED ENOUGH TO AVOID SIGNIFICANT INTERFERENCE.

## GROUND UNDER REPAIR

The committee has determined a rut that clearly has tire tread marks within it, is ground under repair. To take relief, you must find the nearest point of **complete** relief from the ground under repair and drop your original ball (or another ball) away from the ground under repair and within one club-length of that point, **not** nearer the hole.

## PREFERRED LIES (LIFT, CLEAN AND PLACE)

When a player's ball lies in a part of the *General Area* cut to fairway height or less, the player may take free relief **once** by **placing** the original ball (or another ball) in and playing it from this relief area: One club-length from the reference point (spot of the original ball). NO closer to the hole and **MUST** be in the *General Area*.
