AGA: Arizona Golf Association

The Arizona Golf Association (AGA), which was founded in 1923, is a not-for-profit 501(c)(4) association that serves as the official governing body of amateur golf in Arizona. What started as a small group of golfers who got together to run the annual Amateur Championship has grown to an association of more than 700 men's and women's clubs, serving nearly 80,000 individual members. Today, the AGA is a volunteer-based organization directed by amateur golfers passionately dedicated to promoting the game of golf and providing valuable benefits and services to its members.

Each year the AGA sponsors a "State Medallion" tournament. ILGA participates each year. Four play days are designated for "State Medallion" play days. Each player is included that participates in the play of the day. At the end of the year, the player with the lowest gross scores will be awarded the Low Gross Medallion. The player with the lowest net scores will be awarded the Low Net Medallion. Players are not required to participate in all four rounds. The two lowest scores are used. The Gross and net winners will represent ILGA in the State Medallion Tournament.
