- 4. Eliminate the Mixed Summer Classic (discussion with SBMGA to follow).

Electronic Scoring Update

Congratulations to all who have learned how to use the electronic scoring. Everyone did so successfully on June 28! Here are some tips (thank you, Francie):

- After logging on to Golf Genius App, enter the GGID located on the top left of the paper scorecard to get started.
- If someone is a No Show or withdraws from the round, leave the score boxes BLANK across from that person's name. If you put in an X, meaning no score, Golf Genius interprets that as her maximum score and scores accordingly. When the scores are posted, that score gets posted as well. This is definitely a no-no!
- Frequently compare the electronic and paper scores. Signatures on the paper score mean both scores agree.
- Refrain from driving while scoring electronically!
- Enter only gross scores for posting purposes. Golf Genius will score the game. IF
 you want to also score the game, please use a regular scorecard. Play day
 scorecards will be popped and provide your handicaps.
- If a player picks up, mark the score with an "x" as in "x7". Golf Genius will post the score, but the player may be ineligible to participate in the game depending on the game of the week.

Important Reminder: Please mark your ball. There have been several mishaps lately in this regard. It is a two-stroke penalty if you hit the wrong ball.
